East Midlands

Europa Oil & Gas plc has submitted their [planning application](#) for a wellsite at Burniston to North Yorkshire Council. Europa [published](#) their interim results for the five months ending 31 December 2024.

Angus Energy plc [published](#) their Annual Report and Notice of Annual General Meeting.
